## BRIEF BIOGRAPHY

It will probably surprise people to learn that Lee Silber was once a competitive surfer who went on to start a line of surfwear and a chain of retail stores in San Diego.

He is best known as the author of 24 books including the popular “Creative Person” series for Random House, the game-changing *Wild Idea Club* for Career Press, and the award-winning book, *Sunshine*. Silber has won 11 awards for literary excellence including the prestigious Theodore S. Geisel Award.

For many of his books he has immersed himself in the story; Going homeless on the streets of San Diego to write, *The Homeless Hero*. Spending time with his dying friend Sunshine Blake to write, *Sunshine*. Living on Kauai to write, *Runaway Best Seller* (that one wasn’t a tough assignment). More recently, going all in to write the book, *The Pelican*—about a teacher contemplating suicide.

Others know him for his unique presentation style. Silber uses stories, humor, and activities to anchor key ideas in his presentations so attendees learn and remember the important points. Seeing Lee live is more of an experience as his fast-paced presentations use a variety of visual, auditory, and kinesthetic methods so no learner is left behind. These techniques were honed with over 1,500 presentations (including 250 as a lead trainer for SkillPath Seminars) and have made audiences think, laugh, and learn since 1991.

Lee lives with his wife of 25 years and their two sons in Mission Beach, California.
